This funding will be used to

- Ensure students demonstrate growth (aim twelve months) in the year through tracking academic achievements, in all learning areas.
- Support student groups to ensure that all students can access the curriculum at the appropriate year level.
- Teachers review the curriculum every six months to refine current plans and to adjust future plans to incorporate real contexts, current events and ensure cross disciplinary links established.
- Whole school reading framework implemented as evidenced by consistency throughout classroom displays and metalanguage, students able to articulate choice of reading and decoding strategies.
- All students achieving a C or above through clear alignment between achievement standards and Guide to Making Judgements. Differentiation enacted, to enable students to demonstrate required skills and knowledge.
- High order thinking evidenced through STEAM and cross disciplinary units, students able to transfer their learning to these situations.
- High attendance data achieved through high yield teaching strategies that heighten engagement for all students.
- All students tracked against the literacy and numeracy continuum showing growth within the twelve months.

Our initiatives include

- Increase teacher and teacher aid capability in teaching literacy and numeracy through focused profession development, including literacy continuum, numeracy continuum and coaching cycle.
- "Yarwun State School Reading Placemat", created and implemented through collegial processes.
- Implementation of stage two "Yarwun Global Citizen", working as part of a community to obtain the skills and knowledge of the 21st Century.
- Careful planning and community consultation to ensure students see clear connections between school, the local area and the world.
- Teaching staff attend all Cluster Moderation and Pre-moderation sessions to encourage collegial understanding of the Australian Curriculum.
